Report on the audit of the financial statements

Opinion

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of E-Net Entertainment Private Limited ("the Company"), which comprise the balance sheet as at March 31, 2024, and the Statement of Profit and Loss and statement of cash flows for the year then ended, and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the aforesaid financial statements give the information required by the Companies Act, 2013 ('Act') in the manner so required and give a true and fair view in conformity with the accounting principles generally accepted in India, of the state of affairs of the Company as at March 31, 2024, its profit (or Loss) " and cash flows for the year ended on that date.

Basis for opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with the standards on auditing specified under section 143 (10) of the Companies Act, 2013. Our responsibilities under those Standards are further described in the auditor's responsibilities for the audit of the financial statements section of our report. We are independent of the Company in accordance with the code of ethics issued by the institute of Chartered Accountants of trists together with the ethical requirements that are relevant to our audit of the financial statements under the provisions of the Act and the rules thereunder, and we have fulfilled our other athical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements and the code of ethics.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

Key audit matters

Key audit matters are those matters that, in our professional judgment, were of most significance in our audit of the financial statements of the current period. These matters were addressed in the cordexi of our audit of the financial statements as a whole, and in forming our opinion thereon, and we do not provide a separate opinion on these matters.

Reporting of key audit matters as per SA 791 is not applicable to the Company as it is an unlisted company.



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Emphasis of Matter

As more specifically explained in Notes to the financial statements, the Company has made a detailed assessment of its liquidity position for the next year and the recoverability and carrying value of its assets comprising property, plant and equipment, investments inventory and trade receivables. Based on current indicators of future economic conditions, the Company expects to recover the carrying amount of these assets. The Company continues to evaluate them as highly probable considering the orders in hand. The Company will continue to closely monitor any material changes arising of future economic conditions and impact on its business.

Our opinion is not modified in respect of this matter.

Management's responsibility for the financial statements

The Company's board of directors are responsible for the matters stated in section 134 (5) of the Act with respect to the preparation of these financial statements that give a true and fair view of the financial position, financial performance and cash flows of the Company in accordance with the accounting principles generally accepted in India, including the accounting standards specified under section 133 of the Act. This responsibility also includes maintenance of adequate accounting records in accordance with the provisions of the Act for safeguarding of the assets of the Company and for preventing and detecting frauds and other irregularities; selection and application of appropriate accounting policies; making judgments and estimates that are reasonable and prudent, and design, implementation and maintenance of adequate internal financial controls, that were operating effectively for ensuring the accuracy and completeness of the accounting records, relevant to the preparation and presentation of the financial statement that give a true and fair view and are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the financial statements, management is responsible for assessing the Company's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless management either intends to liquidate the Company or to cease operations, or has no realistic alternative but to do so.

The board of directors are also responsible for overseeing the Company's financial reporting process

Auditor's responsibilities for the audit of the financial statements

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. We consider quantitative materiality and qualitative factors in (i) planning the scope of our work; and (ii) to evaluate the effect of any identified misstatements in the financial statements.

We communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit and significant audit findings, including any significant deficiencies in internal control that we identify during our audit.

We also provide those charged with governance with a statement that we have compiled with relevant ethical requirements regarding independence, and to communicate with them all relationships and other matters that may reasonably be thought to bear on our independence, and where applicable, related safeguards. NOTE 2 : BASIS OF PREPARATION AND SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

2.1 Basis of Preparation and Measurement

2.1 Basis of Preparation

The financial statements have been prepared and presented under the historic cost convention on accrual basis of accounting, in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles ("GAAP") applicable in India. GAAP comptises mandatory accounting standards as prescribed under Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 ("Act") and pronouncements of the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India, the provisions of the Act (to the extent notified).

2.2 Key Accounting Estimates and Judgements

The preparation of standalone financial statements requires management to make judgments, estimates and assumptions in the application of accounting policies that affect the reported amounts of ussets, liabilities, income and expenses. Actual results may differ from these estimates. Continuous evaluation is done on the estimation and judgments based on historical experience and other factors, including expectations of future events that are believed to be reasonable. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised prospectively.

2.3 Amendments to Schedule III of the Companies Act, 2013

Ministry of Corporate Affairs (MCA) issued notifications dated 24th March, 2021 to amend Schedule III of the Companies Act, 2013 to enhance the disclosures required to be made by the Company in its financial statements. These amendments are applicable to the Company for the financial year starting 1st April, 2021 and applied to the standardore financial statements as required by Schedule III.

2,4 Significant Accounting Policies

The significant accounting policies used in preparation of the standalone financial statements are as under

Property, Pland and Equipment

Property, plant and equipment is stated at acquisition cost net of accumulated depreciation and accumulated impairment losses, if any. Cost of acquisition or construction of property, plant and equipment comprises its purchase price including import duties and non-refundable purchase taxes after deducting to ade discouras tebraes and any directly attributable cost of bringing the item to its working condition for its intended use.

Subsequent costs are included in the asset's carrying amount or recognised as a separate asset, as appropriate, only when it is probable that future economic benefits associated with the item will flow to the Company and the cost of the item can be measured reliably. All other repairs and maintenance cost are charged to the standalone statement of profit and loss during the period in which they are incurred

Gains or losses that arise on disposal or retirement of an asset or, increased as the difference between net disposal processis and the carrying value of property, plant and equipment and are recognized in the summent of profit and less when the same is derecognized.

Depreciation is calculated on provata basis on straight-line / WD\ ments a based on estimated useful life prescribed under Schedule II of the Companies Act, 2013. Freehold land is not depreciated.

Development expenditures on an individual project are recognized at cost as an intangible asset when the following conditions are satisfied.

- e) It is probable that the asset will generate future economic benefits
- d) Adequate resources are allocated to complete the development and to use or sell of the asset of fixpenditure attributable to the intangible asset during development can be measured reliably

Goodwill is initially recognised based on the accounting policy for business combinations and is tested for impairment annually.

Assessment for impairment is done at each Bulance Sheet due as to v better these is any indication that an intamplific asset may be impaired. If any such indication exists, the Company estimates the recoverable amount (higher of net realisable value and value in use) of the asset. If such recoverable amount of the asset is less than the current; account, the carrying amount is reduced to the recoverable amount. The reduction is treated as an impairment loss and refrectioned in the Statement of Profit and Loss.

Revenue Recognition

Revenue is recognized to the extent that it is probable that, the economic benefits will flow to the Company and the revenue can be reliably estimated and collectability is reasonably assured.

Revenue from sale of goods is recognised when control of the products being sold is transferred to our customer and when there are no longer any unfulfilled obligations. The Performance Obligations in our contracts are folfilled at the time of dispatch, delivery or upon formal customer acceptance depending on customer terms.

Revenue is measured on the basis of sale price, after deduction of any made discounts, volume rebates and any trace or daties collected on behalf of the Government such as goods and services tex, etc. Accumulated experience is used to estimate the provision for such discounts and rebates. Revenue is only recognised to the extent that it is highly probable a significant reversal will not occur.

Unbilled revenue represents earnings on ongoing fixed price and time and material contracts over and above the amounts

Other revenues

Income from interest is being accounted for on time proportion basis taking into account the amount outstanding and the applicable rate of interest.

Employee benefits

Employee benefits payable wholly within 12 months of leaving emologies service; are classified as short term atoployee benefits. These benefits include salaries and wagesbonus and explanta. The undisconnted amount of short term employee benefits to be paid in exchange for employee services is recognized as an expense as the related services is rendered by employees.

Provident Fund

Eligible employees receive benefits from the provident fund, which is a defined contribution plan. Both the employee and the Company make monthly contributions to the provident fund plan equal to specified percentage of the covered employees' basic salary. The Company has no further obligations under the plan beyond its monthly contributions. Contributions to provident fund are charged to the statement of profit and loss on accrual basi

Grattrity

The Company provides gratuity, a defined benefit retirement plan covering eligible employees. The Company provides the gratuity benefit through annual contribution to Life Insurance Corporation ("LIC"). Liabilities related to the grantity plan are determined by actuarial valuation using projected unit credit method carried out by an independent actuary as at the balance sheet date. Actuarial gain or loss is recognised immediately in the national of profit and loss.

Foreign currency transactions:

Foreign exchange transactions are recorded at the rate provailing (a) the date of the respective transaction. Monetary assets and habilities denominated in foreign currencies as at the balance shoat date are translated at the closing exchange rates on that date. Non monetary items which are carried in terms of historical cost denominated in a foreign currency are reported using the exchange rate at the date of the transaction. Exchange differences arising an ibraign aschange transactions satisfy during the year and on restatement as at the balance sheet date are recognized in the statement of profit and loss for the year.

Income Taxes

Income-tax expense comprises current tax (i.e. amount of tax for the period determined in accordance with the income-tax law) and deferred tax charge or credit effects of timing differences between accounting income and axable income too that period). Income-tax expense is recognised in profit or loss except that has expense related to items recognised directly in reserves is also recognised in those reserves.

NOTES: SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES FOR THE YEAR ENDING 31 MARCH, 2024

1 CORPORATE INFORMATION:

E NET Entertainment Private Limited (hereinafter referred to as the 'Company') is registered in Guntur, India, and is a wholly owned subsidiary of SITi broadband Services Private limited. (Hereinafter referred to as the 'Parent Company'). The Company is in the business of providing Internet services to the end consumers.

2 BASIS OF PREPARATION:

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Indian Accounting Standards (Ind AS) as prescribed by Ministry of Corporate Affairs pursuant to Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 ('Act') read with relevant rules of the Companies (Accounts) Rules, 2014 read with companies (Indian Accounting Standard) Rules, 2015 and the provisions of the Act the the extent residied).

All assets and liabilities have been classified as current and non-current as per the Company's normal operating cycle and other criteria set out in the Schedule III of the Act. Based on the nature of business and the time between the acquisition of assets and their realization in cash and cash equivalents, the Company has ascertained its operating cycle as 12 months for the purpose of current and non-current classification of assets and liabilities

3.1 USE OF ESTIMATES:

The preparation of the financial statements in conformity with Ind AS requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent liabilities on the date of the financial statements and reported amounts of revenues and expenses for the year. Actual results could diffe from these estimates. Estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Any revision to accounting estimates is recognized prospectively in the current and future periods.

Borrowing costs directly attributable to acquisition or construction of those fixed assets which necessarily take a substantial period of time to get ready for their intended use are capitalized.

3.2 RECOGNITION OF REVENUE:

Revenue is recognized when it is probable that the economic benefits will flow to the Company and it can be reliably measured. Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received/receivable net of rebates and taxes. The Company applies the revenue recognition criteria to each separately identifiable component of the sales transaction. Subscription income is recognized on completion of services and when no significant uncertainty exists regarding the amount of consideration that will be derived.

3.3 RECOGNITION OF INCOME AND EXPENSE:

Items of income and expenditure are recognized on accrual basis.

3.4 Cash & Cash Equivalents

Cash & Cash equivalents comprise of cash at bank and in hand, cheques in hand and short term. Investments with an original maturity of three months or less.

3.5 TRADE RECEIVABLES:

Trade Receivable are recognized initially at fair value and subsequently measured at amousted cost using the effective interest method, loss promise for impairment. These are subsequently adjusted with the credit risk involved.

3.6 PLANT, PROPERTY AND EQUIPMENT

Plant, properties and equipments are carried at the cost of acquisition or construction less accumulated depreciation. The cost includes non-refundable taxes, duties, freight and other incidental expenses related to the acquisition and installation of the respective assets.

. Depreciation on property, plant and equipment is provided on the straight-line method, computed on the basis of useful lives.

Leasehold improvements are amortized over the lease term or estimated useful life, whichever is less. Leasehold land is amortized over the effective period of lease.

Plant and equipment taken over under scheme of arrangement in the earlier years are depreciated over the management's estimate of remaining useful life, a period of 5 years

The residual values, useful lives and method of depreciation of are reviewed at each financial year end and adjusted prospectively, if appropriate.

Assets costing less than Rs 5,000 each are depreciated in full excluding residual value in year of purchase.

Intangible assets are amortized using straight line method over the estimated useful life.

No depreciation has been provided on tangible assets where the remaining carrying amount is equal to the 5% of the original cost.

3.7 INVESTMENTS:

Non-current investments are carried at cost less any other-than-temporary diminution in value, determined separately for each individual investment.

Current investments are carried at the lower of cost and fair value. The consoarison of cost and fair value is done separately in respect of each category of investment.

However, the company does not have any investments during the current year.

3.8 INVENTORIES:

Inventories are valued at the lower of cost and net realizable value. Cost of inventories comprises all cost of purchase, cost of conversion and other costs incurred in bringing the inventories to their present location and condition.

However, the company does not have any inventory during the current year.

3.9 INCOME TAXES:

Tax expense comprises of current and deferred tax. Current income tax is measured at the amount expected to be paid to the tax authorities in accordance with the income Tax AcI, 1961 exacted in India.

Deferred income taxes reflect the impact of timing differences between taxable income and accounting income for the year and reversal of timing differences of earlier years.

During the current year, the company has incurred lesses and hence there is no tax liability

3.10 EVENTS OCCURRING AFTER BALANCE SHEET DATE:

Events occurring after balance sheet date which affect the financial position to a material extent are taken into cognizance, if any.

3.11 PROVISIONS, CONTINGENT ASSETS AND CONTINGENT LIABILITIES:

Provisions are recognized only when there is a present obligation, as a result of past events, and when a reliable estimate of the amount of obligation can be made at the reporting date. These estimates are reviewed at each reporting date and adjusted to reflect the current best estimates. Provisions are discounted to their present values, where the time value of money is material.

Contingent liability is disclosed for:

- Possible obligations which will be confirmed only by future events not wholly within the control of the Group or
- •Present obligations arising from past events where it is not probable that an outflow of resources will be required to settle the obligation or a reliable estimate of the amount of the obligation cannot be made.

Contingent Liabilities are generally not provided for in the accounts are shown separately under notes to the accounts if any.

Contingent assets are neither recognized nor disclosed. However, when realization of income is virtually certain, related asset is recognized.

3.12 FOREIGN CURRENCY TRANSACTIONS:

Appendix B to Ind AS 21, Foreign currency transactions and advance consideration. On March 28,2018, Ministry of Corporate Affairs ("MCA") has notified the Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Amendment Rules, 2018 containing Appendix B to Ind AS 21, Foreign currency transactions and advance consideration which clarifies the date of the transaction for the purpose of determining the exchange rate to use on initial recognition of the related asset, expense or income, when an entity has received or paid advance consideration in a foreign currency. The amendment will come into force from April 1, 2018.

3.13 REVENUE FROM CONTRACTS:
