### Significant Accounting Policies and Notes to Accounts:

### 1. Background

Siti Prime Uttaranchal Communication Private Limited (hereinafter referred to as 'the Company') was incorporated in the state of Delhi on 18<sup>th</sup> July, 2014. The company was originally incorporated with the name Capital Digital Multimedia Network Private Limited. The company has changed its name to Siti Prime Uttaranchal Private Limited on 13<sup>th</sup> April, 2015.

The Company is engaged in distribution of television channel through analogue and digital cable distribution network.

The Company has entered into an slump sale agreement dated 31st July 2015 with M/S New Prime Network, a partnership firm to purchase the Cable business i.e providing cable TV services to the subscribers, from M/s New Prime Network having operation in Dehradun (Uttarakhand) at a consideration of ₹ 2,50,00,000/- (Rupees Two Crore and Fifty lakhs Only). The seller (M/s New Prime Network) hereby transfer and/or assigns the benefits of all contracts together with the cable connections provided to the cable operators and subscribers and/or direct point subscribers relating to the cable business in favor of the Company. The Company shall be entitled to all the rights and benefits under the contracts and shall be exclusively entitled to collect subscription charges from the Subscribers including Cable Operators and Direct Cable Points. Against the purchase consideration of ₹ 2,49,74,127/- the company has bought explicit fixed assets of ₹2,49,74,127/-.

### 2. Basis of Preparation

The financial statements have been prepared under historical cost convention, on accrual basis, in accordance with the generally accepted accounting principles (GAAP) in India and comply with the Accounting standards prescribed under Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 ('the Act') read with Rule 7 of the Companies (Accounts) Rules, 2014 (as amended). The accounting policies have been consistently applied by the Company.

All assets and liabilities have been classified as current and non-current as per the Company's normal operating cycle and other criteria set out in the Schedule III of the Act. Based on the nature of business and the time between the acquisition of assets and their realisation in cash and cash equivalents, the Company has ascertained its operating cycle as 12 months for the purpose of current and non-current classification of assets and liabilities

#### 3. Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumption that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the results of operations during the reporting period. Although these estimates are based upon management's best knowledge of current events and actions, actual results could differ from these estimates.

#### 4. Fixed Assets:

#### **Tangible**

Tangible Fixed Assets are recognized as per the criteria specified in Accounting Standard (AS) 10 "Fixed Assets" i.e., cost less depreciation. Cost comprises of the purchase price and any allied cost such as Freight, Commissioning cost, Custom etc., including interest, attributable to bringing the asset to its working condition for its intended use.

### **Intangible Assets and Amortization**

- a) Intangible assets are recognized as per the criteria specified in Accounting Standard (AS) 26 "Intangible Assets" as specified in the Companies (Accounting Standards) Rule, 2006 and are amortized as follows:
  - a. Preliminary Expenses are written off in terms of AS-26.
  - b. Goodwill on acquisition is amortized using the straight-line method over a period of five years.

### 5. Depreciation:


Depreciation/ amortization on fixed assets is provided on pro rata basis to the period of use based on straight line method at rates specified in Schedule-II to the Companies Act 2013 except in case of intangible assets and leasehold improvements and as per Accounting Standard (AS) 6 "Depreciation". In view of the management such rates represents the useful life of such assets.

Further as part of management policy the residual value of assets is assuming to be 5% of the cost of the asset.

As per management the life of Set Top Boxes is estimated to 8 (eight) years, hence depreciated at 12.5% on Straight Line Method (SLM) basis.

### 6. Revenue Recognition

Revenue is recognized to the extent that it is probable that the economic benefit will flow to the Company and the revenue can be reliably measured.



#### Income from Services

- Subscription revenue and other Services revenue are recognized on completion of services.
- Carriage fees are recognized on accrual basis over the terms of related agreements.
- Advertisement revenue is recognized when the related advertisement appears before the public. Other Advertisement revenue for slot sale is recognized on period basis

### 7. Provisions and Contingent Liabilities:

Provisions are recognized for liabilities that can be measured only by using a substantial degree of estimation, if:-

- a. The company has a present obligation as a result of a past event
- b. A probable outflow of resources is expected to settle the obligation and
- c. The amount of the obligation can be reliably estimated

Reimbursement expected in respect of expenditure required to settle a provision is recognized only when it is virtually certain that the reimbursement will be received.

Contingent Liability is disclosed in the case of:

- a. A present obligation arising from a past event, when it is not probable that an outflow of resources will be required to settle the obligation.
- b. A possible obligation, unless the probability of outflow of resources is remote

Contingent Assets are neither recognized, nor disclosed.

Provisions, Contingent Liabilities and Contingent Assets are reviewed at each Balance Sheet Date.

### 8. Cash & Cash Equivalents

Cash & Cash equivalents are comprise of cash at bank and in hand, cheques in hand and short term investments with an original maturity of three months or less.

### 9. Income Tax

Tax expense comprises of current and deferred tax in accordance with Accounting Standard (AS) 22 "Taxes on Income". Current income tax is measured at the amount expected to be paid to the tax authorities in accordance with the Indian Income Tax Act, 1961 enacted in India. Deferred income taxes reflects the impact of current year timing differences between taxable income and accounting income for the year and reversal of timing differences of earlier years.

Deferred tax is measured based on the tax rates and the tax laws enacted or substantively enacted at the balance sheet date. Deferred tax assets and deferred tax liabilities are offset, if a legally enforceable right exists set off current tax assets against

current tax liabilities and deferred tax liabilities relate to the taxes on income levied by same governing taxation laws. Deferred tax assets are recognized only to the extent that there is reasonable certainty that sufficient future taxable income will be available against which such deferred tax assets can be recognized only to the extent that there is reasonable certainty that sufficient future taxable income will be available against which such deferred tax assets can be realized. In situations where the company has unabsorbed depreciation or carry forward tax losses, deferred tax assets are recognized only if there is virtual certainty supported by convincing evidence that they can be realized against future taxable profits.

At each balance sheet date the Company re-assesses unrecognized deferred tax assets. It recognizes unrecognized deferred tax assets to the extent that it has become reasonably certain or virtually certain, as the case may be that sufficient future taxable income will be available against which such deferred tax assets can be realized.

### 10. Impairment of Assets

As at each Balance Sheet date, the carrying amount of assets is tested for impairment so as to determine:

- a. The provision for impairment loss, if any required; or
- b. The reversal, if any, required of impairment loss recognized in previous period.

Impairment loss is recognized when the carrying amount of assets exceeds its recoverable amount.

Recoverable amount is determined:

- i) In the case of individual assets, at the higher of the net selling price and the value in use;
- ii) In the cash generating unit (a group of assets that generates identified, independent cash flows), at the higher of cash generating unit's net selling price and the value in use;

(Value in use is determined as the present value of estimated future cash flows from the continuing use of an asset from its disposal at the end of its useful life)

### 11. Earning Per Share

In accordance with AS-20 "Earning Per Share" as notified by the Companies (Accounting Standards) Rules, 2006, (as amended) basic earning per share is calculated by dividing the net profit or loss for the year attributable to equity shareholders by the number of shares outstanding during the year.

#### 12. Provisions

A Provision is recognized when the company has a present obligation (legal or constructive) as a result of past event; it is probable that an outflow of resources will be required to settle the obligation, in respect of which a reliable estimate can be made. Where the company expects some or all of a provision to be reimbursed, the reimbursement is recognized as a separate asset but only when the reimbursement is virtually certain. The expenses relating to any provision is presented in the income statement net of any reimbursement. Provisions are not discounted to their present value and are determined based on best estimate required to settle the obligation at the Balance Sheet date. These are reviewed at each Balance Sheet Date and adjusted to reflect the current best estimates.

- 13. There is no amount due to Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises as per the Micro, Small and Medium enterprises Development Act, 2006.

  The above information regarding Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises have been determined to the extent to which parties have been identified on the basis of information available with the Company.
- 14. The Company is a service company and accordingly information required under paragraph 4(C) of Part II of Schedule VI to the Companies Act 1956 is not applicable to the Company.


